CLINIC

With Howard on vacation, he left us a NMRA video clinic on detailing structure interiors. This was written/presented by Mike Tylick, from a recent NMRA convention. Unfortunately, Larry's computer (the video was a dvd/cd) has sound problems and even with a mic and amp, the sound was not very good. But I happened to hear these few tips- Easy windows- shades made of paper/tape, shade pulls made from wire with a very small drop of glue then painted white. Easy interiors are pictures of interiors mounted on back wall of building, showing through windows. Wall details can be drawn on with colored markers! Furniture made from scrap stuff - people from modeling clay or use cheapest people as details don't matter most of the time, unless you are in a larger scale. You just need to put stuff inside, to make it look lived in or occupied! If you are willing to do a clinic, please, e-mail or call or see Howard at the meetings and share your thoughts.

Former Div 6 member Ken Chick wrote an email on Sunday, Jan 25: Don Watson passed away peacefully in his sleep this morning about 2am He would have been 87 this April. He was a resident in the Medilodge of Sterling Heights for the last year. When I last visited him there, he was in good spirits, was mobile and his memory was in respectable condition, considering what he had suffered thru the last

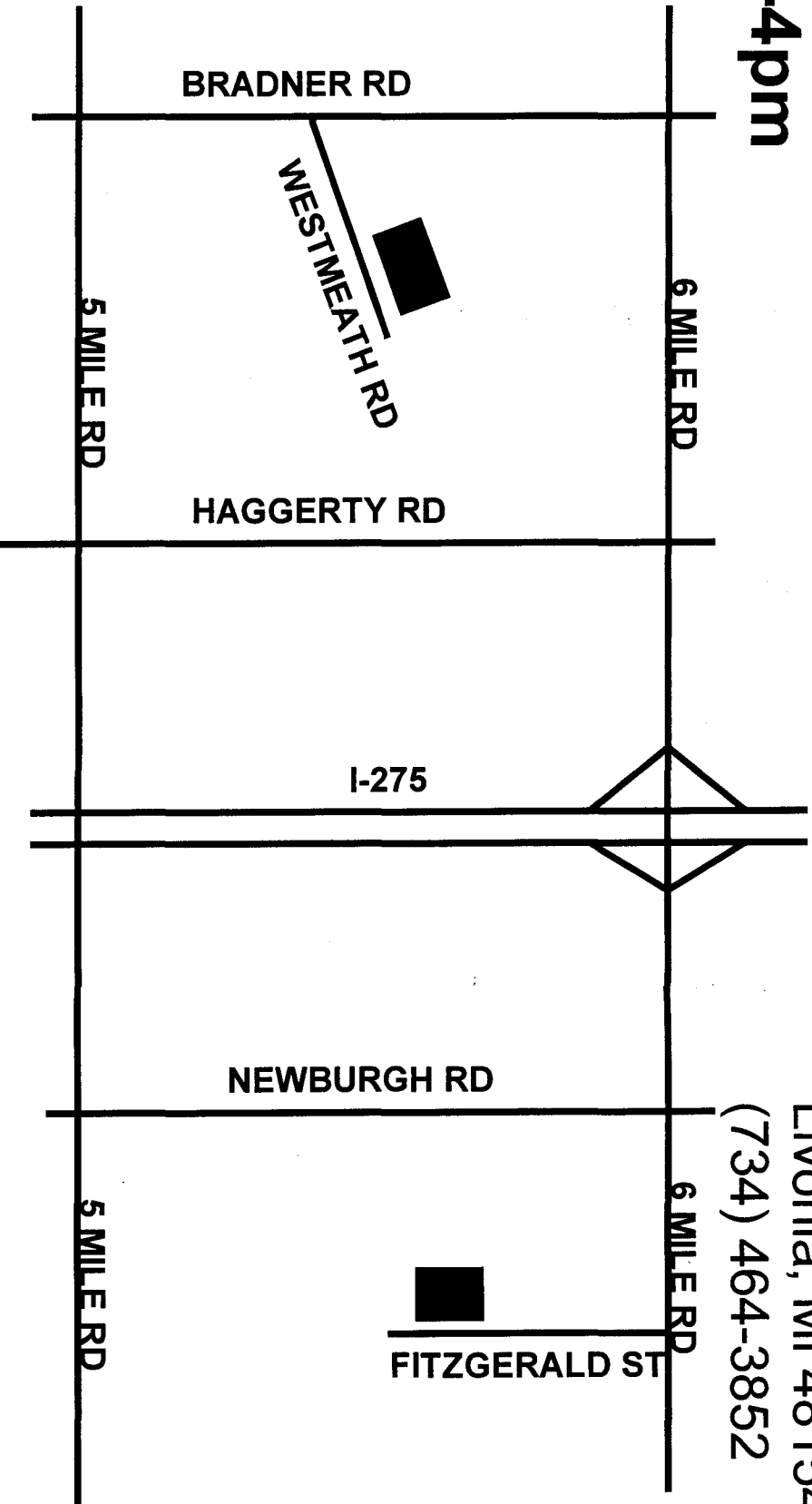
year. He enjoyed playing cards with the other residents, talking about railroading and visiting with his friends. He is survived by his wife Ilene, who is living with his daughter Debbie Watson in Sterling Heights, and his son Robert living in Green Bay, Wisconsin. Don was a dedicated model railroader. When I first met him, he was working on his N Scale Clinchfield from the plans in Model Railroader. Some years later he sold that and built his N Scale BNSF, again from plans in MR. It was never quite finished but he worked on it until his stroke forced him into a nursing home. As you know, Don was also the Div 6 Historian. He researched and wrote interesting stories from the past of many railroads. His "lessons" were always filled with interesting facts and colorful tidbits of rail history. All of those lessons are still intact and Ilene told me that when they clean up all of his material, she would get them passed on to the Region. Many of you will also remember Don's great dry humor. He frequently had something to say that started out with such a serious note, then ended with a chuckle. And, the notes he sent out to invite his club members to his meetings were always laced with a good jab at one of the group. Don had, some time back, written up his last request for this time.
